ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY/BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH	Thomas Dobozy ([1940?] -) was born in Hungary and came to Powell River in 1957 with the Sopron University Forestry Department during the Hungarian Revolution. Dobozy graduated from UBC and returned to Powell River to work at the mill for MacMillan Bloedel Ltd. One of the projects he worked on was building the access road from Mowat Bay to the Powell River log pond. This private road included an underpass on Highway 101 between Townsite and Westview so that the logging trucks would not have to cross the public road.
